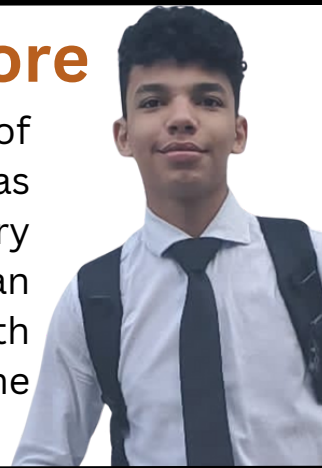


Hannah Olson, Junior
